Approximately fifty guests wearing masks gathered (with proper distancing) in the new parking lot to listen to local, state, and federal officials speak and cut the ribbon on the state-of-the-art facility.

The list of speakers included Mayor Bochenski of Grand Forks, Todd Feland, the City Administrator, Director of ND DOT, Bill Panos, a letter from ND Governor Doug Burgum by Mason Sisk, ND Governor's policy advisor on Transportation, and representatives for North Dakota Senators, John Hoeven and Kevin Cramer.


The Ramkota Hotel has extended our block of rooms to August 21, 2020 so please make your reservations if you are planning on attending.


Drive-Up Window Jessica Pickett, Director Palace Transit - Mitchell, SD

Thanks to a DOT/FTA grant, Palace Transit was able to add a drive-up window, freshly paved parking lot as well as revamp the interior of the facility to give it's customers access to our vital services in the midst of the coronavirus pandemic.

The drive-up window was created for Palace Transit customers to purchase their public transportation tokens, pick up lost and found items, fill out transit paperwork, or

In just its first month of operation, the drive-up window has been a popular service among the

community. It has also allowed us to extend our office business hours to 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Inside the building, several office areas also underwent some renovations. The building has a nicer area for people to sit and do paperwork, rather than leaning over employees desks, and there is flow and cohesion within the building and offices.
